Date May 31, 2017

Hi all,

Thought I should provide you all with an update since we've had a couple of meetings and an abbreviated board meeting since my last update.

We had our pancake day on May 13. Normally our spring pancake day has been held in March and on a Sunday, so this was kind of new territory for us.

We served 172 customers – approx.. 20 less than we served in April 2016

We grossed \$1547.00 compared to \$1551.80 in April 2016.

Looks like profits will be around \$900 - \$1000.

It was great to have most of our members there to help make it a success.

Jim George, who has moved to Nevada from Perry, is transferring his membership. Welcome Jim. Thank you for your help at pancake day just shortly after attending your first meeting here.

They were unanimously approved at the April 26 meeting.

Normally new officer installation would be last meeting in June. Jerry would like To have our District Governor due the installation, but she can only be able to do it at the June14 meeting, so we'll do it then.

There was a good turnout to serve pancakes and eggs at Food at 1st on May 8.

After our regular 5/24 meeting we had a very short board meeting to pay bills.

At the May 10th meeting District Governor Elect Judy Stone, who is a member of the Marshalltown Lions Club, presented their success with selling boxes of peaches.

They make \$5.00 - \$7.00 per box and sell a 1000+ boxes.

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What do you members think of this project? We will need to decide at the May 10 Board meeting but I would like to have everyone's input because it will require a club wide effort to make it a success.,

Some general info to get your thought process going:

Delivery date is determined ahead of time so customers will know when they have to pick up.

Forklift would be desirable to unload truck.

We might need a large cooler to store product.

Sales would probably be somewhat less than what the Marshalltown Lions Club has achieved since they have built up customers over several years.

Marshalltown takes delivery 2nd week of August. Usually on a Friday for customer pickup on Sat.

Marshalltown uses preprinted, duplicate style forms to record sales.
